

## **2009 AASH NATIONAL CONFERENCE INFORMATION 7/29/08**

The 2009 National Conference of the Associated Alumnae and Alumni of the Sacred Heart (AASH) will take place from Thursday, April 23 through noon Sunday, April 26, 2009, at The OMNI Hotel in Los Angeles, California with no-host pre-tours scheduled for April 22<sup>nd</sup> and the morning of April 23<sup>rd</sup>.

### **BACKGROUND AND THEME**

The Conference will be dedicated to St. Rose Philippine Duchesne, who in 1818 came to the United States as a missionary and founded the Schools of the Sacred Heart. She was canonized in 1988, and is one of the saints depicted in the tapestries of the Communion of Saints at the magnificent Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels in Los Angeles. The Conference theme reflects her missionary work and philosophy, **“Missionaries of the Heart: Here to Make a Difference.”**

### **2009 AASH NATIONAL CONFERENCE LOGO**

The Conference Logo, designed by Arizona Sacred Heart alumna, Michelle Stapley, reflects the diverse nature of the Western Region, i.e., Arizona, British Columbia, Canada, California, Colorado, Nevada, Washington, and Wyoming. The West’s natural elements include the Pacific Ocean, the mountains, and indigenous vegetation such as palm and citrus trees. The freeway and high-rise buildings reflect the dynamic national and international business centers of the West. Near the ocean at the far left of the logo is depicted the Santa Monica Pier, one of the landmarks of metropolitan Los Angeles. The world famous “Hollywood” sign hovers over Los Angeles and a composite of the Los Angeles San Fernando and San Gabriel missions founded by Fra Junipero Serra in the 1700’s. The Society of the Sacred Heart logo in miniature, a ribbon in the shape of a heart encircling the world, is tucked neatly under the largest citrus leaf. Leaves falling from the citrus trees turn into heart shaped leaves (like anthuriums), reminding us the Sacred Heart of Jesus is present with us everywhere.

The flower selected as the theme flower for the Conference is the red anthurium.

**TOUR II BUS TOUR TO RSCJ MISSION AT SOBOBA INDIAN RESERVATION, AND SHOPPING AT ONTARIO MILLS (discount shopping) all day, no host lunch; returns by 4:30 p.m.**

The RSCJ ministry at the Soboba Indian Reservation ministers to little St. Joseph Church, to St. Jude School and to the Soboba Band of Luiseño Indians. In the late 1700's this area served as a cattle ranch for Mission San Luis Rey (hence Luiseño Indians). St. Joseph's, not a part of the chain of missions founded by the Franciscans some 100+ years earlier, was founded in 1888. Its purpose is to serve the Indian people; hence its informal title as an, "Indian mission church." The church, the school, and the RSCJ convent are steps from each other and across the street from the Soboba Casino.

We will visit with Sr. Marianna Torrano and the other RSCJ's at Kateri Tekakwitha Center and hear about their ministry, including their challenges in building St. Jude school. Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha was a young Mohawk woman who lived in the 17<sup>th</sup> century. The story of her conversion to Christianity, and her extraordinary holiness is an inspiration to all Christians. Many are praying that Blessed Kateri will become the first Native American saint.
